The back wall is wall-to-wall glass shelving holding amber bottles upon amble bottles, subtly backlit to give them that extra glow. Bartenders us a sliding aluminum ladder to reach whichever bottle you point to. A personal favorite is High West's Double Rye, but chances are if you're whiskey drinker they'll have your favorite too.
